### This term in Nursery, we will be

#### <u>Reading</u>

Stories to get to know the children 'Topsy and Tim start school' is a great story to help settle children into their new environment. 'Owl Babies' and the 'Birthday' stories are a great way for us to really get to know the children.

We are also going to be reading lots of different traditional stories over the next term. We are reading these books because they have a repeated storyline which we will be encouraging the children to use when they are acting out the stories. We will be finding out about different animals from the stories using the I Pad to give us the information.

#### Maths

We are still singing nursery rhymes everyday and will be using percussion instruments to tap out beats to the rhymes. Nursery rhymes are so important and being able to sing a selection of them will really help your child with the first stages of reading by themselves.

We are continuing to use the Numberblock episodes from Cbeebies to think about numbers. We have met the characters 1,2,3,4,5 and now know what they look like. This term we will be thinking about how to count objects accurately and how to identify which numbers are the biggest and which are
