Human features	Where people live, what they do and how they use the land.
Physical features	The natural features on Earth that would occur if even if there were no humans.

Core Vocabulary

Tropics	Regions of Earth that lie roughly around the equator.
Hemisphere	Half of the Earth from the equator to either the north or south pole.
Mediterranean	Relating to or located near the Mediterranean Sea.
Capital	The city that holds the seat of a country's government.

1	Europe has different zones. The further east from the UK, the greater the time difference.
2	Locate & name the UK, Spain, Germany, Italy & France in relation to surrounding bodies of water on a world map.
3	The capital city for the UK is London; Madrid for Spain; Berlin for Germany; Rome for Italy; Paris for France.
4	Some famous landmarks are Tower of London (UK), Eiffel Tower (France), Colosseum (Italy), La Sagrada Familia (Spain).
5	Some physical features of Europe are River Seine (France), River Danube (Europe), The Alps (Europe), The Giant's Causeway (Ireland), Snowdonia Mountain Range (Wales).
6	Compass points include N, E, S, W, NE, SE, NW, SW.
