- 3) **LS Lowry's paintings of city life were full of people that are described as matchstick men. These are small images of people with skinny legs and arms.**
- 4) **In his artwork, LS Lowry only used a few colours which included ivory, red, black, blue and yellow.**
- 5) **LS Lowry declined five honours in his life including a knighthood from the Queen because he didn't want anything in his life to change.**



Key Facts

- 1) **The Great Fire of London started in Thomas Farriner's Bakers shop on 2nd September 1666.**
- 2) **Samuel Pepys kept a diary of the events in 1666.**
- 3) **The Great Fire of London is extinguished on 6th September 1666.**
- 4) **On Tuesday 4th September, St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.**
- 5) **Local residents carry their possessions to nearby boats on the River Thames to keep them safe.**
