- 2) LS Lowry was inspired when he worked as a rent collector.
- 3) LS Lowry's paintings of city life were full of people that are described as matchstick men. These are small images of people with skinny legs and arms.
- 4) In his artwork, LS Lowry only used a few colours which included ivory, red, black, blue and yellow.
- 5) LS Lowry declined five honours in his life including a knighthood from the Queen because he didn't want anything in his life to change.

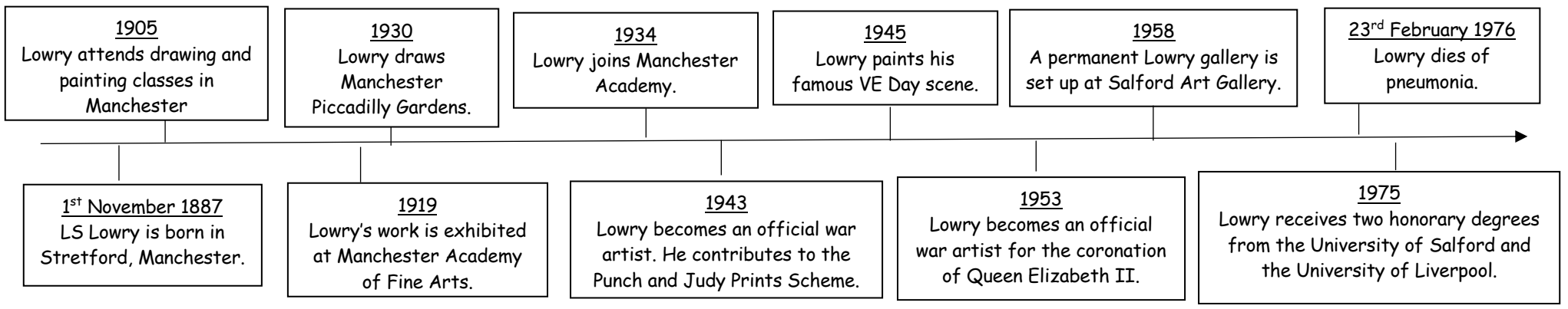
### Vocabulary

### Key Facts

- 1) **The Great Fire of London started in Thomas Farriner's Bakers shop on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1666.**
- 2) **Samuel Pepys kept a diary of the events in 1666.**
- 3) **The Great Fire of London is extinguished on 6<sup>th</sup> September 1666.**
- 4) **On Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> September, St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.**
- 5) **Local residents carry their possessions to nearby boats on the River Thames to keep them safe.**

<b>Samuel Pepys</b>	A diarist who live in London in 1666.	<b>River Thames</b>	A river that flows through southern England including London. It is 215 miles long.
<b>Parliament</b>	Is the law making group in the government of the United Kingdom.	<b>The Tower of London</b>	A historic castle located on the north bank of the River Thames in central London.

<b>Blaze</b>	A very large or fiercely burning fire.
<b>Plague</b>	A contagious, bacterial disease.
