Our topics this term will be...

English:

This half term in English we will be focusing on Non-Fiction in English. With a specific focus on Non Chronological Reports. We will be doing this using a Talk for Writing approach so we will be learning the report off by heart and putting actions to it as well as changing the text to make it our own. We will be using this as an opportunity to create lots of other writing opportunities too. We will be looking at different sentence types, including full stops, capital letter and exclamation marks and begin to create our own.

How can I help at home?

Maths:

This half term in maths we will be revisiting all of the calculations (\times , $-$ + and \div) and continuing to look at fact families such as $13 + 7 = 20$, $7 + 13 = 20$, $20 - 7 = 13$ and $20 - 13 = 7$. We will be revisiting fractions, a half and a quarter. We will be learning about position and direction, including left and right. We will also be continuing to solve one step word problems by visualising and drawing the problem to support our working out. We will be learning to compare and sequence intervals of time, as well as quarter to and quarter past the hour and learning how many hours in day, days in a week, months in a year etc.

Spellings will be sent home weekly for your child to learn along with their results of the test from the week before. The children enjoy learning their spellings in school so please continue this at home. Please ensure your child completes at least one piece of homework from the home learning

Please ensure your child wears black school shoes each day as well as the correct uniform as detailed on the school website, the same applies for PE. We feel this has a high impact on standards in school and this is why it is vital.
