Dear Parents/Carers of pupils in the KS1 bubble,

I am writing to inform you that a pupil/staff member within the KS1 bubble has tested positive for coronavirus. In line with advice from Public Health England, the school will now close the KS1 bubble for deep cleaning and self-isolation.

Whilst I understand that you may have concerns with regards to the above, I can assure you that the school has, and will continue, to follow social distancing measures and cleaning and hygiene arrangements in place throughout each day.

Your child however, has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for the virus and in line with government guidance, we are asking that you keep your child at home to self-isolate for 10 days and follow the guidance below.

You may be notified by the NHS Track and Trace service via text message, email or phone that your child is a contact. See information below from the national guidance:

- If you have been informed that your child is a contact of a person who has had a positive test result for coronavirus (COVID-19), medical advice is clear: your child must immediately self-isolate at home for 10 days from the date of their last contact with them. **There is no requirement for other members of your household to self-isolate unless anyone in your household starts to develop symptoms.**
- Your child must not go to school.

If you or your child begin to show symptoms you must follow the national guidance. For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness. However, if you develop symptoms you must self-isolate at home and arrange to have a test to see if you have COVID-19 – visit [NHS.UK](https://www.nhs.uk) to arrange or contact NHS 119 via telephone if you do not have internet access.

Please inform the school of any positive results.

Your child can return to school on 25/01/21 (you will be notified via text when the isolation period ends). Your child should access home learning resources either via a paper based learning pack which you can collect from the school office or through our 'SeeSaw' online learning platform. SeeSaw is the preferred method for remote learning as it provides interaction with the class teachers.
